ANTIQUES & COLLECTIBLES

Tinker Belle Antiques was started over 60 years ago, by Pat and Helen Burk, when Heisey & Cambridge glass was in it's heyday of collectible glass. By 1970, Helen began collecting Depression glass and formed the first Depression Glass club in the United States. For many years, she also promoted the first glass shows in the area. The International Depression Glass Club is still holding shows the 1st weekend in February and August. In 1975, Helen was the guest of honor at the Glass Convention in Washington D.C.

Specializing in glassware, Helen participated in many Walter Zarzen's shows in Nevada. Some of her customers included Bill Cosby, Mac Davis, Joan Rivers, Ruth Buzzie, Debbie Reynolds and Librace! In 2007, 2 of Helen's friends opened Antiques & Collectibles at 413 5th Street in Marysville. They asked Helen to end her 10 year retirement and join them in the business. 2 years later, Helen was running the show and the shop still stays open 7 days a week, from 10a-4p.



THE CIGAR BOX

The Cigar Box is the oldest bar on D Street. It originated in the 1950's, on the 200 block of D Street, but relocated during the renovation of the downtown area. It has resided at 311 D Street since 1976.

The Cigar Box was purchased by the Wooten family in the early 1990's, bringing history back to the walls and making it a favorite for many locals. In 2009, the establishment purchased a full liquor license, allowing customers the opportunity to enjoy their favorite alcoholic beverages along with the "coldest beer in town".
